

Decorative Label Window Box



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
Supplies & Measurements:

- Affectionately Yours Designer Washi Tape (141635)
- Crumb Cake Cardstock (120953)
 - 3-1/2" x 5" (for the bow)
 - 6-1/4" x 5" (for the box) Sample box is made from a Crumb Cake note card (133766)
 - 3-1/4" x 1-7/8" (for the window lining)
- Crumb Cake Classic Stampin Pad (126975)
- Bone Folder (102300)
- Decorative Label Punch (120907)
- Bow Builder Punch (137414)
- Tear & Tape Adhesive (138995)
- Window Sheet (142314) 3" x 1-3/4"

Directions:

Box


1. On the long side (6 1/4") side, score at 3/4", 2-3/4", 3-1/2" and 5-1/2".
2. On the shorter (5") side, score at 3/4" and 4-1/4".
3. Fold and reinforce all score lines with a bone folder. Then referring to the diagram, cut on the dashed lines to create tabs along each of the long edges. (Fold on the solid lines; cut on the dashed lines.) Make a small diagonal notch on each edge of the tabs to cut off the score line.
4. To ensure perfect window placement, cut a label from lightweight scrap paper, using the Decorative Label punch. Center and adhere the scrap label to the large section between Flap A and Flap B. Fold Flap A under, line up the scrap label in the window of the Decorative Label Punch, and punch the opening.
5. Add adhesive to the edge of the window sheet and attach it behind the window opening. Clean up the inside of the window by cutting a decorative label in the 3-1/4" x 1-7/8" paper, aligning it with the window and adhering it on top of the acetate - inside the box.



- Using tear tape to attach Tabs 2 and Tabs 3 to Flaps E. This is the base of the box. Attach Tabs 1 to Flaps D to create the cover. Use a sponge to ink all edges with Crumb Cake. Let dry and decorate with washi tape.

Bow

- Punch two Loops, two Tails and one Loop Wrap, using the Bow Builder punch.
- To break down the paper fibers, pull each piece between your thumb and the bone folder four or five times until the pieces begin to curl. (The bow on the sample box is made from a Crumb Cake envelope, so the paper is more pliable than cardstock.)
- Ink all of the edges and apply washi tape.
- Attach end A to end B to create a loop. Repeat with the second loop. Adhere the flat loop ends on top of each other to create a bow shape. Cover the overlapping ends with the Loop Wrap.
- Attach the thin ends of the tails to the back of the Loop Wrap, and adhere the finished bow to the corner of the box window with tear tape.



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
